From the M25, leave at J5 on to the A21 South, heading towards Sevenoaks and Hastings

At the foot of the hill bypassing Sevenoaks take the B245 at the big roundabout and go through the village of Hildenborough.

Follow this road to North end of Tonbridge, where there are two sets of traffic lights close together, go through the first set of traffic lights and then Tonbridge School is on your right.

At the second set of lights turn left towards Maidstone/all other routes * (just before the Ivy House public house): the road is first called Bordyke and then becomes Hadlow Road.

Follow this for about 2½ miles past a large BP petrol station until you come to the 40mph sign at the beginning of Hadlow.

At the pub/restaurant called the Rose Revived Café Bistro turn left into Ashes Lane. **After ¾ mile you will see a little lane on your right with a phone box at the junction. Don't turn off, but look on your left for a large white building, once a pub, count three houses past it on the left and you will find “Hildenborough”, a long white bungalow.

Coming from the South, come into Tonbridge past the railway station on your left and through the High Street till you reach the first big set of lights.

Turn right, which is the continuation of the A26, and proceed from * above.

From South East if travelling on M20 leave at J4 take the A228 (to Tonbridge) this becomes the A26 through Hadlow village ¼ mile through Hadlow you will find the Rose Revived (pub) on your right proceed as above**

From East Kent or from J3 of the M25, you can follow the M20, leaving at J2 on to the A20 and follow the signs for Paddock Wood till you see signs for Hadlow and Tonbridge.

Drive right through the village of Hadlow and ½ mile further you will find the Rose Revived (pub) Café Bistro on your right.

Turn right here down Ashes Lane and proceed from ** above.

- † Please note that “Hildenborough” is the name of the bungalow and don't be confused by the name of the nearby village of Hildenborough on signposts!
